Why mentorship?

In the spring of 2021, we launched the mentorship aspect of our TYCOP program in an effort to connect First Nations youth with mentors who can help them navigate the often confusing and overwhelming process of finding & selecting a postsecondary program that's perfect for them!

Benefits of mentorship:

- It provides mentees a support system during critical stages of development
- Provides mentees with insight, perspective, support, and direction when navigating their career path
- Mentees will receive specialized support and resources to fit their needs
- Develops learning, analytical and reflective skills in mentees
- Develops or reinforces self-confidence
- Encourages ongoing learning and development throughout life

The Technical Youth Career Outreach Project (TYCOP) is an initiative of the Ontario First Nations Technical Services Corporation. TYCOP encourages career choices that create future capacity in areas that are vital to First Nations operations. By showcasing Indigenous role models and connecting First Nations youth with mentors, we aim to address the gaps Indigenous youth face when it comes to obtaining post-secondary education. Our hope is that this will lead to increased technical service capacity and future technical selfreliance for First Nations in Ontario.

Who is eligible to participate?

Mentees:

• First Nations youth in Ontario who are currently in grades 7 - 12.

Mentors:

- First Nations technical professionals from across Canada are eligible to mentor our students.
- Must pass police background check.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Do I need to be sure of my career path/what I want to do when I'm older to participate?

A: Not at all! Even if you don't want to take one of the technical careers listed on the next page, this program could still be beneficial to you.

Q: How long will the program run and what's the time commitment?

A: We are currently in the first cohort of the program which will be running for 6 months from April - September 2021. Mentees can expect a minimum of one 30minute mentoring session per month, with the option for more sessions if needed.

What are technical service careers?

Some examples of technical careers include infrastructure specialists, housing inspectors, architects, civil engineers, environmental monitors or scientists, water and wastewater mechanics and operators, firefighters, emergency planners, welders, public works managers, construction workers, geologists and so much more.
